**SUBJECT:** UPDATE REGARDING THE REGISTRATION OF MARBLE HALL AS A WHEAT DELIVERY POINT INCLUDING REQUIREMENTS FOR OUTLOADING AS RECEIVED FROM AFGRI

Further to market notice 800/2015, the JSE hereby confirms that Marble Hall silo remains deregistered as a JSE wheat delivery point. Our records show that 550 tons remains on JSE silo receipts.

Afgri Grain Management met with DAFF whom has agreed that the Executive Officer may allow the movement of the wheat infected by Karnal Bunt in terms of the Agricultural Pest Act, 1983 (Act No36 of 1983) subject to the following conditions:

1. Each of the silo owner, outloader, transport company and mill/processing plant must apply for a removal permit in the format of Annexure A as attached;
2. Each of the silo owner, outloader, transport company and mill/processing plant must provide the respective undertaking in the format of Annexure B as attached;
3. The undertakings must be on a letterhead and signed by a manager.

After approval from the DAFF Executive Officer, removal permits shall be issued to move the wheat.

Afgri, in its capacity as silo owner, has provided its required undertaking to DAFF, which DAFF as accepted (see Annexure B1).

All participants who own wheat in Marble Hall silo are therefore required to follow the above process in order to take delivery of the wheat. Afgri has further informed the JSE that in addition to providing the undertaking to DAFF, it has also:

1. Tested a representative sample of each bin with the SAGL. These results are available from Afgri and only 4 samples tested positively VAT 0.04% and 0.04% bunted kernels respectively. The rest tested 0% bunted kernels.
2. In terms of DAFF's Technical Manual on Karnal Bunt of wheat as complied with the Division Plant Health Promotion, Directorate Plant Health and Quality (DPHQ) it is stated that wheat with karnal bunt is not toxic to humans or animals. Wheat containing more than 3% bunted kernels is generally considered unfit for human consumption.
3. The SAGL tests therefore confirmed that the infected wheat is significantly below the 3% threshold for human consumption.
4. Afgri washed, cleaned and treated the silos and conveyor belts in order to further mitigate contamination.

Further to the above described information, the JSE reminds market participants of Appendix C, section 9 of our detailed contract specifications which deals with Disputes and should these arise requires the JSE to be informed of such and also the manner where an arbitrator will be appointed to resolve this.
