Applicability of policy + data types:

This Policy applies to all Non-Display Use of the Specified Non-Display Data subject to payment by the Contracted User of the applicable Non-Display fees.

Specified Non-Display Data is the following data (sourced <u>indirectly</u> and/or <u>directly</u> from the JSE):

- a) Live Level 1 Equities data; Live Level 2 Equities data;
- b) Live SENS data;
- c) Live Equity Derivatives data; Live Commodity Derivatives data;
- d) Live Currency Derivatives data*;
- e) Live Public Bond ETP data*;
- f) Specified EOD Data.

Specified EOD Data is End of Day Equity data and/or End of Day Interest Rate Market data which is used for the **Calculation of Own Indices** (use of data to calculate an index).

What is non-display?

Non-Display Use is the accessing, processing, consumption or use of Data for any purpose other than in support of its display or distribution.

Non-Display Use is classified into the following categories:

The use of data in trading related activities and/or non-trading related activities. 2 Non-Display External The use of data for the operation and/or in support of other activities.

Non-Display Internal - the use of data in trading related activities and/or non-trading related activities.

Trading related activities include, but are <u>not</u> limited to:

i.

- algorithmic trading, program trading, black box trading; high frequency trading, basket trading
- 2. automated and semiautomated order generation
- order management; smart order routing
- 4. execution management
- price referencing for the purposes of algorithmic trading



Non-trading related activities (which may produce a derived output) include, but are <u>not</u> limited to: 1. risk management

risk management quantitative analysis instrument/portfolio valuation surveillance systems pre/post trade analytics, trade cost analysis

Non-Display External - the use of data for the <u>operation</u> and/or in <u>support</u> of other activities.



What is a non-display unit/application?

JS≡ A **Non-Display Application** is each instance of an application which is used to access, process, # of Units relate to or consume the data for the purpose/s of Non-Display (internal or external) ND fees. [Unit Fee | Fixed Fee (>5 Units)] A Non-Display Unit is: **Non-Display External** Non-Display Internal Each Non-Display Application and/or platform, **Calculation of Own Indices** Each Non-Display Application. system, service, function or activity, which uses the Each index created. data for the operation and/or in support of the **activity** (excluding Calculation of Own Indices).

Each Non-Display User is required to enter into a data agreement with the JSE. (NB for Vendors)







3 The Non-Display fees do not replace any other data fees applicable to any other use of the Specified Non-Display Data.

5 For backup reasons, can receive the same Data from another source. Both feeds permitted under the same fee, but must ensure that the feeds are not conducting Non-Display Use at the same time.
