



Sustainability Segment

The JSE Sustainability Segment launched in June 2020 to enable the listing of debt instruments which are used for raising listed debt where the proceeds are ring-fenced for activities directed at sustainable development.

These include:



Green bonds
Including energy, water and waste



Social bonds
Including UN SDGs, housing, schooling and health



Sustainability bonds
A combination of green and social bonds which are specifically earmarked to raise funds for climate, social and environmental projects

Fast Facts

1 The JSE has long championed sustainability. It was the first emerging market and the first stock exchange globally, to introduce a sustainability index in 2004 which was replaced by the FTSE/JSE Responsible Investment index series, and allows for listed companies to be assessed using the same rating model that is applied to over 8000 companies globally

2 The JSE is home to the existing FTSE/JSE Responsible Investment Index and launched the Green Bond Segment in 2017. This was expanded into the sustainability segment in 2020, and from April 2022 includes transition bonds and sustainability linked bonds

3 The JSE continues its pioneering commitment to Responsible Investment through the UN Partnership programme, the Sustainable Stock Exchanges initiative

4 JSE Group CEO, Leila Fourie currently co-chairs the United Nations' Global Investors for Sustainable Development Alliance (GISD), which aims to leverage finance and investment know-how, in order to scale up private sector contributions to the circa \$2 trillion annual funding gap of the Sustainable Development goals

5 The JSE joined the Race to Zero Partner Initiative through the Net Zero Financial Service Providers Alliance (NZFSPA), and the Glasgow Financial Alliance for Net Zero (GFANZ) to promote and champion sustainability measures locally & internationally, and has committed to supporting net zero by 2050
